## SEVEREST 'QUAKE SHOCK EVER

Located To Be Either In Northern India Or Western China

BIRMINGHAM, Nov. 28 (Reuters). An earthquake of great severity was reported by the Seismologist, Mr. J. J. Shaw of West, Birmingham, at about 3.20 (G.M.T.) last night.

The centre of the shock was nearly 4,000 miles away and waves appeared to arrive from the east, in which case the location of the earthquake would probably be northern India and western China.

Three, and a half hours after the shock Mr. Shaw reported that the earth was still vibrating considerably.

LOCATION: 1400 MILES WEST OF DELHI

The Seismograph at the Delhi observatory recorded an earthquake shock of great intensity, roughly about 1400 miles west of Delhi at 3.20 a. m. today.

The exact location has not yet been determined.

Karachi Rocked

For Half A Minute

KARACHI, Nov. 28 (A.P.I.). Karachi city was rocked for half a minute this morning by an earthquake of low intensity. There was a rumbling noise with the rocking of the lights and shattering of window panes. The shock was particularly felt on the southern and western parts of the city while in residential side few could realise that there was a tremor. There was no Seismograph at the local Meteorological Office to record the epicentre of the intensity of the quake, no damage or casualty is reported.

The giant clocks at Municipal Corporation and at other places stopped at 3.25 a.m.

Tremors Continue

For Long Time

BOMBAY, Nov. 28 (A.P.I.). The earth tremors continued for a long time and even at 7.30 a.m. the Seismograph at the Colaba Observatory recorded tremors. According to the Colaba Observatory the epicentre of the earthquake must have been about 300 miles North of Bombay but the records have not been correctly made and therefore the Colaba Observatory authorities are not in a position to clearly indicate the exact location of the earthquake. They are, however, in a position to say that the earthquake was a very severe one and in their view it may have occurred in the sea, as otherwise by now reports of serious shocks must have been received from other Seismographs located in the country.

SYDNEY, November 28 (Reuters). The greatest earthquake ever recorded by river-view observatory occurred at 8.11 a.m. local time today. It is considered to be the severest since 1909 and waves of the original quake are still recorded at 1 p.m. The shock appeared to originate some 6,600 miles west of river-view. Spaney.

## INSURGENTS CAPTURE ZENJAN

TEHERAN, Nov. 27, (Reuters): Zenjan, a railway town on the main line from Teheran to Tabriz and roughly midway between the two cities has been completely occupied by insurgents from Azerbaijan, it is announced here. The insurgents are marching on Karvin, the next important centre, 85 miles northwest of Teheran.

Ebrahim Hakimi, the Persian Prime Minister, today saw M. Jabokov, the Soviet Charge D' Affaires.

Nothing has been disclosed regarding the meeting, but in some Government quarters there is a strong belief that only direct talks between the Persian and Soviet Governments can give results.

## Another Firing Victim Dies

CALCUTTA, Nov. 28, (U.P.I.): Mr. Sashi Kanta De (22) who was removed to hospital with bullet wounds during the Calcutta disturbances, died yesterday. From all accounts the total admission into different hospital until November 25 is 137 out of which 32 died.

It is learnt some medical students donated their blood to many dying patients.

## 'Election Neither Fair Nor Free Nor Honest'

### Worst Type Of Nazi Tyranny Perpetrated By Organised Party Against An Individual

Mr. Chundrigar in his statement to the representative of the "Bombay Chronicle" has attempted to contradict the statement of Mr. Huseinbhai Lalljee wherein he stated, how his car was pelted and he was stopped from entering his booth. Mr. Chundrigar may very well say whatever pleases him, but when he eulogizes the services of the police and returning officers we can only appeal to the observations made by the public at large as to what was the state of affairs in Anjuman-e-Islam and other polling stations.

Mr. Chundrigar talks about the immense enthusiasm evinced by the Muslim public, but one fails to understand if hoodliganism can be taken to mean enthusiasm. His Excellency the Governor visited the booths and we all know how his car was stopped. May we ask His Excellency to say if this is the manner in which elections for the House of Commons are fought in England? Or can we by any stretch of imagination treat this election as fair and frank, fought on democratic lines.

To my mind this election in Bombay displayed the worst type of Nazi tyranny perpetrated by an organised party against an individual. We all know how a man in the position of Mr. Syed Abdulla Brelvi, President of the All-India Peace Conference, who can very well claim to represent the voice of Nationalist Indians today and is so very well-known throughout the city of Bombay, was treated by the

workers of the Muslim League and the masses that had assembled there. Did a man in his position deserve jeerings, threats and actual spitting at his face?

What did Mr. Chundrigar and the police and the returning officers do on that occasion? It is for Mr. Chundrigar to explain. How many others were similarly treated will be known to the world at large later on and it is no use multiplying instances at this stage.
