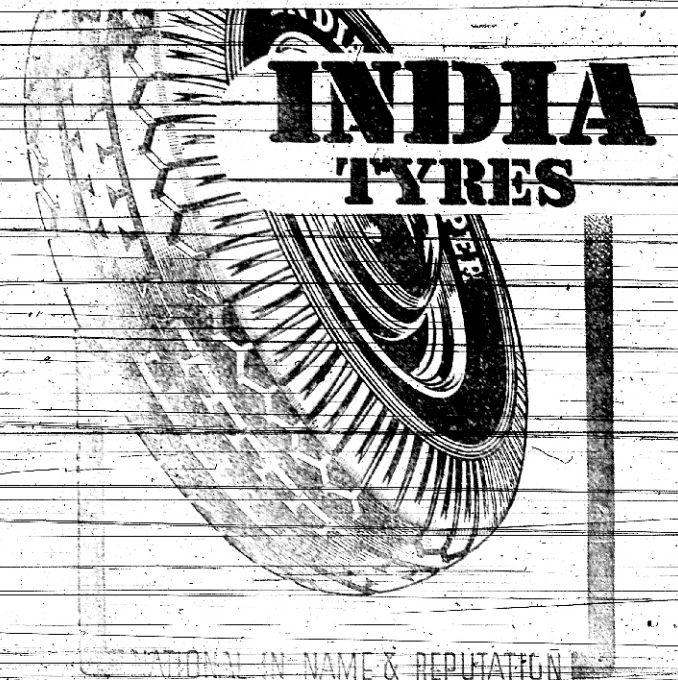

STUDENT'S DELEGATION REFUSED VISA

BOMBAY, 28.—The Government of India have not given the necessary passport facilities to enable a delegation sponsored by the All-India Students Congress to proceed to Prague to attend the International Students' Conference which is being held there, according to the Student's Congress.

The General Secretary says: "The All-India Students' Congress had decided to send a delegation to the International Students' Conference at Prague and application for passports were made. But I regret to announce that the delegation has not been able to proceed for the Conference in time as Government has not given the necessary passports."

"It was our earnest desire to participate in the Conference and place before the world the case of India and other subject countries. We have been deprived of our right of association with the students of the other nations by the indifference and negligence of Government."—API.

2 KILLED IN TRAIN-CAR COLLISION

GORAKHPUR, 28.—A goods clerk posted at Padrauna railway station and a business man were killed when their car collided with the engine of a passenger train about 50 miles from Gorakhpur yesterday.

It is reported that the driver of the car, underestimating the speed of a passenger train near the distant signal of Padrauna railway station, attempted to cross the track at high speed.

When the front wheels of the car struck the engine, the engine overtook the car, lifted it and threw it several yards away. The two passengers were killed on the spot, while the driver received serious injuries. The car was reduced to smithereens.—API.

SEVEN KILLED IN LORRY SMASH

JAMMU, 27.—Seven persons were killed and two seriously injured in a lorry accident on the Bhatnagar road when the lorry fell into a ditch.—API.

TIDAL WAVES FOLLOW EARTHQUAKE

KARACHI, 28.—A strong tidal wave occurred in the Arabian Sea near Karachi as a result of which the coastal country craft traffic is said to have been dislocated. About 100 ft. of rocky shore near Karachi Harbour and Manora Island have been damaged. A large quantity of fish is reported to be lying on the Mekran coast.

Bombay also reported a sudden tidal wave which swept away two fishermen and two women from near Juhu beach. Several small craft broke their moorings.—API.

PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICER

NEW DELHI, 29.—The Home Department of the Government of India have appointed a public relations officer to keep the department in closer touch with editors and newspapermen, press correspondents, members of the Central Legislature and the general public on matters of concern to the Department.

Capt. R. L. Rau, formerly Public Relations Officer GHQ, has been appointed to this post.—API.

ALLAHABAD

CONGRESS COMMITTEE MEETING

ALLAHABAD, 28.—Whether Congress should be a platform or a party organisation with full support of the working classes who form the major portion of India's population is an important question which is engaging the attention of Congress workers in these and other provinces. The question, it is learnt, will be discussed by the Sub-Committee of the UP Provincial Congress Committee which will be meeting here on November 28 under the convener'ship of Mr. Keshavdev Malaviya. As a first step to make Congress a strong party organisation of the working classes it is proposed to abolish the system of enrolling Congress members and to substitute for the registration of members a clause for the registration of members in that they will be enrolled only when they personally apply for registration at the local offices of the Congress Committee. The proposed system also aims at eliminating unhealthy canvassing which has been found in several cases in the various groups among Congress workers.

It is also proposed that the regional organisation of Congress into Mandal, Village or Mohalla Committees should be abolished and a new form of organisation based on important trades or professions like—workers, artisans, mine-workers, etc., be introduced.

GARHWAL

VICTORY DARBAR

GARHWAL, 27.—A Victory Darbar was held at Gauchar on the concluding day of the Bhotiya Commercial Fair under the presidency of Mr. R. V. Verma, Deputy Commissioner, Garwal. It was attended by a large number of persons. Prizes were distributed to Military Officers. Prizes were also given for various exhibits in the Industrial Section of the Bhotiya fair. The War Memorial Government High School, Karnaprayag won a silver shield and a cup.

MOTOR ROAD: The Garwal Sahitya Sabha, and the Garwal Sahitya Sabha assembled at Gauchar requested Government to extend the Kotdwara-Chamoli motor road to Joshimath, which is 19 miles from the famous Bhithu shrine of Bhadrinath. This demand was also backed by a delegation of some representative Garhwalis which waited on Mr. R. V. Verma, Deputy Commissioner at C. Nagar.

ALL-INDIA MUSHAIRA

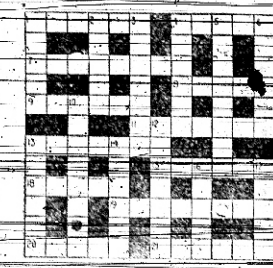
