

# VOLCANIC ERUPTION NEAR KARACHI COAST

## Cause of the 40-Foot Tidal Wave

KARACHI, Dec. 5.—The earthquake shock and the disastrous tidal wave that occurred in the early hours of November 28 was the result of a volcanic eruption that devastated the west coast of Karachi, writes the special correspondent of the Associated Press of India, who travelled in an Indian naval vessel H.M.I.S. "Hindustan," visiting the scenes of the disaster.

Two eruptive rocks of granite colour have appeared in the mid-ocean about 180 miles west north-west of Karachi. These are about three miles away from each other, one being about 30 feet above the surface and the other is about 100 feet high. In shape they are oval. The first rock is about one and a half square miles.

The tidal wave appears to have been unprecedented in its area and as far as it is known here, re-
