

Severest Recorded Since  
1909  
SYDNEY

Nov. 28.—The greatest earthquake ever recorded by the Hawaiian Seismological Observatory occurred at 8-11 a.m. local time to-day. It is considered to be the severest since 1909, and was of the original magnitude of 8.5. It was recorded at 1 p.m.

ported by the great severity of the earthquake of West Bromwich, Birmingham, on about 2-26 (G.M.T.) last night. The centre of the shock was nearly 4,000 miles away and waves nearly 1,000 miles from the East, in which case the location of the earthquake would probably be Northern India or Western China. Three and a half hours after the shock, Mr. Shaw reported that the earth was still vibrating considerably. An earthquake shock of great intensity was recorded by the seismographs at the College of Great Britain.
